



1. Base is the shape of a prow of a ship
2. C. 220-185 BC
3. Made in Samothrace
4. Made of marble
5. Perhaps somewhat of a naval monument (celebrate naval victory around 190 B.C.E) the statue is standing on the prow of a Trihemiolia (a type of ancient Greek ship)
6. From Hellenistic Era
7. Also called “Nike of Samothrace”
8. Now shown in The Louvre, Paris, France.
9. Was discovered in 1863
10. Is 5.57 m tall (including boat piece)
11. It is speculated that one of the lost arms would have cupped the mouth, showing Nike shouting.
