French libertine Baron de St. Julien asked for a portrait of his mistress.

Stylistic:

Foreground the playboy Baron himself is depicted, reclining in the lush shrubbery, one arm outstretched towards the maiden's skirts.

Form:

Pastels & loose brushstrokes emphasize the free and easy nature of the subject matter
