

Tlatilco Female Figurine

Location: Region of Aztec empire
(Existed before the empire, same area though).

Content: Early preclassic period/era (1800-1200 B.C.E.) was when Tlatilco was settled/founded.

Content: Researchers believe that hair and styling was very important to the Tlatilco people.

Time: The figurines date to 1200 through 400 B.C.E



Material: Ceramic

Content: Bicephalic-“Two-headed”

Content: Tlatilco villages were large farming villages and were usually placed near lakes.

Content: Researchers believe that the duck and fish located on other Tlatilco ceramics were motifs.

Content: The figurines were believed to be made by hand, They were painted.

Content: Most of the figurines from Tlatilco were women.
