Roman townhouse, located in ancient Pompeii, Italy

Extravagant decorations and building style lets us know that the people who owned the house where extremely wealthy

Most of the paintings were created by adding color while the plaster was still wet Grafitti shown on House of Vettii shows evidence of the common Roman practice of prostitution

Ancient Roman society used domestic display to show social rank
